The Texas School for the Deaf invites the community to visit its new exhibit exploring the history of the Deaflympics, which is set to run through December 19th at the school, 1102 S. Congress Ave.

Originally held in Paris in 1924, the Deaflympics is

touted as the first international sporting event to be held specifically for athletes with disabilities, according a news release.

Deaflympic medals, memorabilia, uniforms and banners will be on display at the exhibit, which will also chronicle the Texas School for the Deaf members who have participated in the games since the nation's initial involvement in 1957. 





# Texas in History – July 11, 1838: Presidential candidate drowns in Galveston Bay

On this day in 1838, James Collinsworth fell or jumped off a boat in Galveston Bay and drowned. Collinsworth, born in Tenn. in 1806, was a candidate for the presidency of the Republic of Texas. A state monument was placed at his grave in old City Cemetery in Houston in 1931.

husband. children and grandchildren at her Presbyterian Hospital in Plano, Texas. Elizabeth was born of profoundly deaf parents, Leon L. Myatt and Selma Gertrude Fitze. As a young child she learned the skills of interpreting for deaf individuals, a career which she pursued until her passing. Elizabeth became a nationally recognized expert on deafness holding Master's level certification, the highest attainable in the United States. Was a certified legal interpreter and was highly sought after as an interpreter of medical and mental health court cases. Elizabeth was the founding Executive Director of Deaf Action Center in Dallas, Texas and served on its Board of Directors until her death. She served, since its inception, on the state Board of Evaluators of Interpreters of the Texas Commission for the Deaf. She brought the world of deafness to television in Dallas-Fort Worth homes in the 1960's with the first sign language interpreted newscasts. Trained at the New York Psychiatric Institute and Southwestern Medical School she was a skilled counselor of those who are deaf and hard of hearing. was a founding director of ELF Communications which produced seminars and recorded training for sign language interpreters. She was a consultant and first nonphysician member of the medical-technical board of the Arthritis Foundation and the Lupus Foundation. Elizabeth was also named national Volunteer of the Year, by the U.S. Department of Health and Human and the Services, presented with achievement award by the Freedoms Foundation, Valley Forge Honor Society. Nevertheless, considered her greatest honor being called "MY Mimi" by her seven grandchildren. Elizabeth is survived by her husband, John P. Criswell; brother, Ronnie J. Myatt and his wife Jean; daughters, Kendra Leigh Branden and Karen Ann Drennan; step-daughters, Katherine Elaine Criswell and Julie Elizabeth Govan; and grandchildren,



Atchley was welcomed home to heaven on June 9, 2013. Teena was born May 8, 1942, to Forrest and Ruby Atchley of Mount Dora, New Mexico. She passed away June 9, 2013 in Odessa, Texas. She was preceded in death by her parents, Forrest and Ruby

Atchley, and her brother, Wayne Atchley. Teena is survived by three sisters and a sister in law: Violet Brockman of Tramperos Ranch, New Mexico; DeAnna Richardson of Sedan, New Mexico; Elaine Aschbacher and her husband Leon of Tijeras, New Mexico; and Martha Atchley of Amarillo, Texas. She is also survived by 10 nieces and nephews and 30 greatnieces and great-nephews. Other survivors include Ruth Page and a legion of friends. Teena spent 42 years as a deaf educator, beginning as an audiologist, working as a classroom teacher, and finishing her career as a deaf administrator. She taught in Iowa, Utah, Idaho and California before returning to Texas, where she lived for the past 25 years. "With those beautiful hands, she gave the deaf a language" describes her work as an interpreter for the deaf. Teena interpreted in educational settings, church and teaching services, and was guite frequently summoned to interpret for deaf and hard of hearing individuals who were hospitalized or otherwise needed interpreters. Teena was an active member of the First Baptist Church of Odessa, where she was a Sunday School Teacher. She also organized and was the teaching leader of the women's Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) of Odessa. Her deep love of her Lord

and knowledge of scripture were an inspiration and a blessing to the BSF participants. After her retirement, Teena became a hospice volunteer. She also spent a great deal of time in northeastern New Mexico, attending to the business of her farming and ranching interests. A memorial service will be held at First Baptist Church, Odessa, Texas, at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 12, 2013. An additional service was held at the First Baptist Church of Clayton, New Mexico, at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, June 14, 2013. Interment followed in the Clayton Cemetery. #### RECIPE



Johnsonville Fast and Easy Red Beans & Sausage By Dorothy Floyd

#### **Ingredients:**

1 package (13.5 ounces) Johnsonville Andouille Sausage diced

1 tablespoon olive oil

3 stalks celery, diced

1 medium onion, diced

1 medium green pepper, diced

3 cloves garlic, minced

½ cup water 2 bay leaves

¼ to ½ teaspoon cayenne pepper

2 cans (16 ounces each) light red kidney beans

Cooked white rice

In a skillet, brown sausage in oil for 3-4 minutes. Add celery, onion, green pepper and beans. Cover and simmer for 15-20 minutes. Remove bay leaves. Serves over hot rice 6-8 servings Ready in 30 minutes.
