

Fan Facts

When the temperature increases in your surroundings, the cooling effects of fans are limited. Fans will not prevent heat illness when the temperature is in the high 90s. It is important to follow these recommendations:

DO...

- Use a fan only when the windows are open or the air conditioner is on.
- Use your fan in or next to a window. Box fans are best.
- Use a fan to bring in the cooler air from outside or to blow the hot air from the inside to the outside.
- Use your fan by plugging it directly into the wall outlet. If you need an extension cord, it should be UL (Underwriter Laboratories) approved.

DON'T...

- Don't use a fan in a closed room without windows or doors open to the outside?
- Don't believe that fans cool air. They don't. They just move the air around. Fans keep you cool by evaporating your sweat.
- Don't use a fan to blow extremely hot air on yourself. This can cause heat exhaustion to happen faster. If you're afraid to open your window to use a fan, choose other ways to keep cool. See the tips on: Keep Your Cool during Summer Heat.




Edna Lanita Ugarte 1921 – 2011



RECIPES

Zucchini Casserole PizzaBy Rosalyn Gannon to Mary Thumann

1 can crescent roll

4 cups thinly sliced zucchini or squash

¼ cup butter or margarine

1 cup chopped onion

½ cup parsley or 2 tbsp parsley flakes

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. pepper

¼ tsp. garlic powder (I use 2 cloves fresh garlic)

¼ tsp. basil

¼ tsp. oregano

2 eggs

8 oz. grated mozzarella (2 cups)

Roll out and line rectangular baking dish with crescent dinner rolls. Saute zucchini and onion in butter or margarine. Cook about ten minutes. Stir in all spices.

Beat two eggs and mix with cheese then mix into zucchini. Pour into shell and bake at 375 for 18 to 20 minutes.


