


Congress Avenue in the 1880's



In 1905, 110 years ago this week, the City of Austin began paving the city's main street: Congress Avenue. The paving was meted out in segments-the stretch of Sixth Street to what's now Cesar Chavez getting the roll out first. While the pavement signaled a new era in Austin, it also meant the beginning of the end for Austin's streetcar system, Austin Electric Railway-the latest corporate iteration in a revolving door of companies with Congress Avenue right –of-way-which had been operating at a loss since 1891 and, at the city's insistence, had to pay for and implement a good portion of the buildout. But before the electric streetcars, believe it or not, there were mules. Austin's first public transit system relied on a stable of mule-powered streetcars. Like their electric-powered successors, the streetcars operated on rails. (Aren't you glad we don't have dirt roads now? They were very dusty in dry weather and very muddy in rainy weather). 1


### Turn clocks ahead One hour March 13, 2016

Daylight Saving Time (DST) is a system in which clocks are set one hour ahead of standard time for a specified period.










### TY BEANIES

### RECIPE Potatoes Casserole

1 stick butter, divided ½ cup diced onion

1 (32 oz) pkg. frozen shredded hash browns, thawed

2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese

1 (10 ½ oz.) can cream of celery soup

2 cups sour cream

½ tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. black pepper

1 cup coarsely crushed butter flavored crackers

1. Preheat oven to 375. Coat 9x13 inch baking dish with cooking spray. 2. In small skillet over medium heat, melt ½ stick butter. Add onion & saute 4 to 5 min, or until soft. 3. In large bowl combine hash browns, cheese, soup, sour cream, salt pepper, & onion; Mix well. Spoon mixture into prepared baking dish. 4. In small microwaveable; stir in cracker crumbs. Sprinkle cracker mixture over potatoes. 5. Cover baking dish with foil & bake 35 min. Remove foil & bake 10-15 min additional min. or until golden brown & heated through.


