







Lemon Cream Cheese Dump Cake

## 1 hour to prepare serves 8-10 INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (16 oz.) can lemon pie filling
- 1 (16 oz.) package yellow cake mix
- 4 oz. cream cheese, cubed
- ½ cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, thinly sliced

### PREPARATION:

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 and lightly grease a square baking dish with butter or non-stick spray.
- 2. Pour lemon pie filling into the bottom of greased baking dish, making sure to spread it into the corners.
- 3. Top with ½ cake mix; place cubed cream cheese evenly on top, then sprinkle remaining cake mix.
- 4. Take butter pats (as thinly sliced as possible) and lace them in a single layer on top of the cake mix, trying to cover as much of the surface of the cake as possible.

Place baking dish in oven and bake for 35-40 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Remove from oven and let cook 15-20 minutes before serving.


