

Congress Avenue Bridge 1884




The long-needed bridge across the Colorado was finished in 1884 "to last for all time." At first it was a toll bridge, but in 1886 the city bought it. There was a general celebration when the crossing became free.

(TSD students often walked on the railroad bridge or forded across the Colorado River to go to downtown during the 1900's. Sometimes they did not want to pay five cents toll on Congress Ave. Bridge)

Austin's title, "City of Perpetual Moonlight" wasn't yet born in mid-1874, but a start in that direction came in early July of that year.

The Austin Statesman heralded the coming of the era of gas-lit streets, July 10, 1874, "Austin streets," said The Statesman, "A number of street lamps seem ready for the match now, but the moon is answering every purpose for the present."


Turn clocks ahead One hour March 13, 2016





2 cup ketchup 1 cup Pineapple Juice 3/4 cup brown sugar 20 oz. Pineapple Chunks, drained


to save for juice


